## 7. DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT BY “P.M.M. :

### 1. Name of the project:

‘Clean Water, Stronger Women, Smarter Children: Borewells for Marginalized Dalit Communities in 5 Remote Villages (Wells of Hope)’

### Donor agency:

The ESA Humanitarian Relief Fund (HRF), Netherlands.

Padma Mahila Mandali is currently implementing a drinking water project to address severe water scarcity in 5 remote villages of Renigunta Mandal, Tirupati District. The project aims to install 5 borewells to provide safe and reliable drinking water access to 1,650 marginalized Dalit households (approximately 5,500 people).



In these villages, women and children were previously walking long distances (3–4 km daily) and spending several hours collecting unsafe water from open sources. This affected health, reduced income opportunities, and disrupted children’s education. Through this project, borewells are being drilled with proper infrastructure, including platforms and water run-off systems. Village Water Committees are being formed and trained to ensure long-term sustainability and community ownership. Hygiene awareness sessions are also conducted to promote safe water usage and sanitation practices. The project is expected to significantly reduce waterborne diseases, save time for women, and improve school attendance among children. This initiative represents a sustainable solution that enhances health, dignity, and livelihoods in underserved rural communities.

### 2. Name of the project:

‘Unlocking Opportunities: Providing Dictionaries for Rural Underprivileged Students’

### Donor agency:

Europe Third World Association (ETWA), Netherlands.

### Summary:

Padma Mahila Mandali is implementing an education support project to improve English language skills among rural underprivileged students in 7 Government Zilla Parishad High Schools in Khajipet Mandal, Kadapa District. The project aims to distribute 500 English–Telugu dictionaries to students from Dalit and marginalized communities who lack access to basic learning resources.



In rural government schools, students often struggle with English due to lack of support materials, which affects their academic performance and confidence. To address this gap, dictionaries are being procured and distributed in coordination with school authorities.

Orientation sessions are also conducted to help students effectively use the dictionaries in their daily learning.

This initiative will strengthen vocabulary, improve reading and comprehension skills, and enhance overall academic performance. Teachers are actively involved in guiding students, ensuring sustained usage of the materials. The project is expected to reduce educational disparities and provide students with better opportunities for higher education and future employment.

3. Name of the project:

‘Bicycles for Rural School Girls to Improve Access to Education’

Donor agency:

Luena Foundation, United States of America.

**Summary:**

During March 2026, with the support of Luena Foundation, PMM implemented a project to provide bicycles to 20 rural high school girls from economically disadvantaged families in Kothapeta village, Khajipet Mandal, Kadapa District.



Many of these girls were walking long distances daily to reach school, which caused fatigue, delays, and irregular attendance. To address this challenge, bicycles were purchased and distributed to the selected beneficiaries in coordination with school authorities and community members. This intervention has significantly reduced travel time, improved punctuality, and increased regular school attendance. The girls now travel safely and comfortably, which has boosted their confidence and motivation to continue their education. Parents and teachers have expressed strong appreciation for the initiative, noting visible improvements in attendance and participation. The project has created a positive impact by removing a major barrier to education and ensuring that girls can continue their studies with dignity, safety, and hope for a better future.

4. Name of the project :

After-School Evening Tuition Programme for transforming poor children's future

Donor agency :

Aktion Selbstbesteuerung e.V., Germany.

**Summary:**

Launched in January 2025, the *After-School Evening Tuition Programme* established two study centers in Annai Nagar and Vedallacheruvu villages, reaching 105 underprivileged Dalit children.



Classes are conducted 6 days a week and focus on English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Telugu, and Hindi. To make learning engaging, teachers use storytelling, group discussions, and activity-based methods. Special sessions on spoken English and life skills have enhanced children's confidence and communication abilities.

The program has achieved an average attendance of 87%, with children showing measurable academic progress and renewed interest in education. Parents and community leaders actively participate through regular awareness meetings, strengthening sustainability. PMM is proud to unlock the potential of marginalized children, ensuring that education becomes a lasting source of empowerment and dignity.

5. Name of the project :

Bridging Dreams: Promoting School Enrollment for Marginalized Muslim Girls  
Ontario Teachers Federation (OTF), Canada.

Donor agency :

Summary :PMM implemented the above titled project in July, 2025. The initiative supported 100 Muslim minority girls aged 12–16 years in Khajipet Mandal, Kadapa District, by providing essential learning materials such as notebooks, pens, pencils, and school bags. Alongside material support, PMM organized two awareness workshops for parents, teachers, and community leaders, reaching nearly 250 people.



These sessions emphasized the long-term importance of girls' education, challenged cultural barriers, and encouraged families to prioritize schooling over early marriages or household responsibilities. The project has significantly reduced dropout risks and motivated families to send their daughters regularly to school. Teachers reported higher classroom participation, while parents expressed satisfaction seeing their children equipped and motivated. PMM is grateful to OTF Canada for enabling this impactful intervention, which has given marginalized girls dignity, opportunity, and a stronger foundation for their future.

6. Name of the project :

'Empowering Underprivileged Muslim Students in Rural Kadapa District – Bridging Educational Gaps and Fostering Personal Growth'

Donor agency :

H.E.A.T. Foundation Ltd., United Kingdom

PMM successfully implemented this program, in August 2025 reaching 50 underprivileged Muslim girls aged 10–15 years in Kadapa District. The project provided essential learning materials such as notebooks, pens, pencils, and school bags, along with basic sports equipment to promote holistic development. These resources eased the financial burden on poor families, improved school attendance, and enhanced children's motivation and participation. Parents also engaged in awareness sessions,



strengthening community support for girls' education. The programme has given marginalized girls renewed confidence, dignity, and opportunities for a brighter educational future.

7. Name of the project : Distribution of Study Materials to Poor School Children  
 Donor agency : The Shamdasani Foundation, Hong Kong.

With the kind support of The Shamdasani Foundation, PMMi successfully provided essential study materials—including notebooks, slates, slate pencils, writing pads, pens, pencils, and erasers—to 50 poor school-going children of Z.P. High School, Kothapeta, Khajipet Mandal, YSR Kadapa District. Resource persons from the local education department, village elders, and PMM



members actively participated in the programme, sensitizing parents and children on the importance of education. This initiative reduced the burden on disadvantaged families, encouraged regular school attendance, and motivated children to pursue learning with confidence. PMM remains committed to ensuring no child is denied education due to lack of resources.

8. Name of the project : 'Gravel Making & Selling Programme for the sustainable Livelihood of Rural Poor Women'  
 Donor agency : The Associated Country Women of the World (ACWW)" in London, United Kingdom.

This program was implemented in 2 villages of Khajipet Mandal of Kadapa District. The objective of this initiative was to provide 25 rural poor women with a sustainable livelihood by engaging them in gravel making and selling activities. By utilizing local resources and market demand, this program aimed to empower women economically and improve their overall quality of life. Now these women are earning sufficient income and living peacefully.

9. Name of the project : 'Brooms Selling Programme for the Poverty Alleviation among the Weaker Section Tribal Women'  
 Donor agency : The Associated Country Women of the World (ACWW) London, United Kingdom.

The project focused on poverty alleviation among 30 weaker section tribal women. By involving them in brooms making and selling activities, the program aimed to create income-generating opportunities for these women. This initiative aimed to enhance their economic independence and uplift their standard of living. These women are earning good income and becomes with self-sufficient.



10. Name of the project : 'Empowerment of Rural Poor Women Weavers through Handloom Weaving Programme'  
 Donor agency : Stichting Castricum Helpt Muttathara, The Netherlands.

This program aimed to empower 40 rural poor women weavers by training them in handloom weaving. By developing their weaving skills, the initiative provided them with a means to generate income and improve their financial situation. This program aimed to enhance the economic empowerment of women weavers and preserve traditional handicrafts. This project is completed. Now these women are relieved from their poverty and living with a sustainable livelihood source.



11. Name of the project : 'Self-Development of Rural Poor Dalit Women through Stone-Breaking and Gravel Making Programme'  
 Donor agency : Stichting Derde Wereldgroep Soest, The Netherlands,

This program focused on the self-development of rural poor Dalit women. By engaging them in stone-breaking and gravel-making activities, the program implemented and provided 30 very poor women of Khajipet mandal, with livelihood opportunities. Through this initiative these 30 women improved their economic conditions and overall well-being of Dalit women through skill development and income generation.



12. Name of the project :

### **Provision of Study Material to Poor Dalit Children**

We have distributed free study materials such as notebooks, pens, pencils, and slates to 150 poor Dalit children in three villages of Khajipet Mandal in Kadapa District. This initiative aimed to support the educational needs of underprivileged children, ensuring they have the necessary tools for their academic development.

13. Name of the project :

### **'Evening Study Centre to Poor Children'**

Shamdasani Foundation, Hong Kong.

Our organization implemented the "Evening Study Center for Dalit Children" in Khajipet of Kadapa District, this program established 1 evening study center for 30 Dalit children. The center provided a supportive learning environment outside regular school hours, offering academic guidance and assistance to enhance the educational outcomes of Dalit children. The program aimed to bridge educational gaps and empower these children through education.



14. Name of the project :

### **Formation of Women Self-Help Groups**



Our organization formed 10 Women Self-Help Groups in 10 villages of Khajipet Mandal in Kadapa District. Each SHG consists of 10 women. These groups aimed to empower women by fostering a sense of unity, collaboration, and economic independence. Through these groups, women were provided with a platform for collective decision-making, skill development, and accessing financial resources for entrepreneurial endeavors.

### 15) PULSE POLIO PROGRAMME :

Our organization conducted a Pulse Polio Programme, targeting the health and well-being of children in the rural areas of Kadapa District. The program aimed to provide essential polio vaccination to 125 children across four villages, ensuring their protection against this debilitating disease. On the designated day, our team set up vaccination booths in each of the four villages, equipped with necessary medical supplies, trained healthcare professionals, and support staff.



The children and their families were warmly welcomed to the vaccination centers, where the vaccinations were administered following all necessary safety protocols and procedures.

### 16. Women Human Rights Protection Awareness Programme:

We have conducted this programme in 5 villages of Chennur Mandal in Kadapa District, this program focused on creating awareness about women's human rights and protection. It aimed to educate women on their rights, safety, and legal provisions. Through workshops, seminars, and community engagement, the program aimed to empower women to assert their rights and create a safer environment for them.



17. Name of project : “Distribution of Examination Materials to the SSC Students”

Summary: We have distributed study materials i.e., Geometry boxes, Pens, Pencils, Erasers, Long-Scales, Sketch pens for 74 poor girl students studying 10th class students who are participating Public Exams.

With the donation of ‘Shamdasani Foundation, Hong Kong’ we have selected 40 poor high school students who are studying in Zilla Parishad High School, Kothapeta, Khajipet Mandal, Kadapa District. We have distributed study materials i.e., Exam Pads, Geometry boxes, Pens, Pencils, Erasers, Long-Scales, Sketch pens for 40 poor students studying 10th class students who are participating Public Exams.

19. Name of the programme : ‘Eye Health Check-ups Programme for Poor Adults’

Our organization organized an Eye Health Check-ups Programme in Khajipet Mandal, Kadapa District, providing comprehensive eye examinations for adults. Qualified specialists conducted vision tests, screened for refractive errors, cataracts, and glaucoma, and offered advice, treatment, or referrals. Educational materials promoted preventive eye care and awareness. This initiative improved quality of life, reduced preventable vision impairment, and reinforced our commitment to healthcare, education, women’s empowerment, and community development, positively impacting marginalized communities, especially women and children.
